

### **SURVEY SAYS...**

Thanks to the 84 library patrons who completed our 2023 Community Survey! We compiled the results and want to share them with you. Most of the respondents are weekly visitors of the library, followed by a large portion of monthly visitors. Ninety nine percent of respondents rated the library highly, with 82.1% rating it "excellent".

Library Services were rated mostly "excellent," with customer service, policies, hours, and outreach scoring the highest. One patron commented that Spooner Library is a "safe and welcoming place for community members, regardless of beliefs or economic status." Patrons appreciate the varied and creative programming for all ages. Outreach is highly commended, with one user showing appreciation for the Trego bookmobile stop. Digital services, such as Libby, Hoopla, and Kanopy and in house services, such as faxing, scanning, and copying are highly appreciated as well.

Though Library Collection had mostly "excellent" ratings, there were also some "good" and "okay" ratings mixed in. While patrons appreciate the selection and variety, there were requests for more TV series, children's DVDs, inspirational and mystery books, large print, local history books, quilting books, new books, popular magazines, newspapers, puzzles, and board games.

## SURVEY RESULTS CONTINUED...

The survey also included questions about patron experience in the library. All patrons feel safe or very safe in the library. Seventy five percent of patrons agree there is always a place to sit. Ninety two percent of patrons feel the wait time is reasonable. Eighty seven percent of patrons feel the furniture and lighting are comfortable. Sixty eight percent feel the tools/technology/toys available to them are enjoyable or mostly enjoyable.

As we approach a building project, we thought it was important to ask questions regarding the current library space. We were not surprised by the responses. Eighty one percent feel the library needs a refresh. We heard resounding feedback about the need for more space. Comments on a need for new space include: "Continue with your efforts to remodel and expand what is currently a woefully inadequate space for both your staff and the services you provide." We need "a bigger library for community events," "a larger building for group events, speakers, and more collection space," "more space to get rid of the clutter" and more "activity space." Meeting space, comfortable seating, and an improved children's area are highly requested. We are happy to report that 96% feel they would support an expansion project.

We have already made improvements based on the Community Survey results. We have subscribed to the Rice Lake Chronotype which should start coming soon. We have been evaluating our magazine holdings. We have made the children's area better by replacing some well loved toys and adding a dress up station. We have changed the times of some of our events to accommodate more people. The Acquisition Librarians are aware of the concerns about the collection and will work to fulfill requests. We will continue to work toward expanding the library and make sure that meeting rooms, an updated children's area, and better seating are included in the plans. We have already added more games to our Library of Things as well.

Lastly, we want to share some of the responses to the question, "How does the library benefit the community."

- "It is a vital part of the community."
- "Angie and staff have invented and implement food outreach programs that must help many. Bibliodragon,
  Books on Rails attempt to reach rural and homebound residents. Interweaving of community entities, such
  as Ventures workers helping with food parcels, teens doing community garden, etc. strengthens a sense of
  community."
- It is "an equalizer."
- It "brings the community together."
- "It is the community for many of us. All the programs, the free copy machine, the no late fees, the food bags, the lock-in for youth, the friendly, helpful people, the books..."
- "A place of fun and learning for all community members."
- "It is a wonderful asset. Safe location for teens to go after school for learning and reading."








#### **CHILDREN & TEENS: AWARD WINNERS**








### **STORYWALK**


