SURVEY SAYS...

Spooner Memorial Library recently completed a community survey, revealing overwhelmingly positive feedback on its services, collections, and overall experience. The vast majority of respondents rated the library highly across various categories.

Key Findings:

High Satisfaction: A remarkable 94% of respondents rated the library as either "excellent" or "good" overall. This positive sentiment extended to customer service, with a combined 98% rating as "excellent" or "good," underscoring the library's commitment to its patrons. Numerous comments lauded the library's amiable staff, diverse program offerings, and welcoming atmosphere. The library's bookmobile was also singled out as a particularly appreciated community asset.

Popular Services: Reference services (90% excellent/good), interlibrary loan (100% excellent/good), and computers & printing services (100% excellent/good) received exceptionally high marks. Outreach services also scored impressively at 100% excellent/good.

Strong Collection: The library's collection also earned substantial praise. Children's books boasted a combined 100% excellent/good rating, closely followed by adult books (100% excellent/good) and the Library of Things (98% excellent/good).

Areas for Growth: While overwhelmingly positive, the survey also pinpointed areas for potential enhancement. These include: expanding meeting space, improving the children's area, reevaluating the juvenile and young adult collections, adding to the DVD collection, and increasing the selection of LGBTQ+ and Christian books. The need for more space was a recurring theme in the responses.






