We are excited to announce an updated catalog AND a brand new app! With the new app, you'll be able to search for items in our catalog, put items on hold, renew items, and you will have access to some great online resources. To download the app you can search "Northern Waters Libraries" in your app store, use the QR code below, or download it from this link: https://innovativemobile.net/NorthernWatersLibraries.

Here's a basic overview of our new app:

- Once you install the app, log in using your library barcode number and name.
- Tap "Search" and type your query to search the catalog for physical and digital items.
- Tap "My Account" to view your checkouts (both physical and digital items), holds, bookmarked lists (coming soon!), and settings.
- Tap "Online Resources" to access links to online resources including Creativebug, Kanopy, Transparent Language, Badgerlink, and more.
- Tap "Nearest Libraries" for a list of NWLN libraries sorted by distance from nearest to furthest. Tap a library to find hours, website, contact information, directions, and more.
- Tap "Scan ISBN Barcode" and turn your phone's camera into a barcode scanner. Scan the UPC on any book
 to find out instantly if the book is available at your library.


SUMMER READING 2025

BOARD GAMES & MORE



Learn about the natural environment that makes up the Chippewa Valley and Eau Claire area, and get to know the various animals that occupy the region.








Eau Claire Children's Museum Pass - Eau Claire

Great Lakes Aquarium Pass - Duluth

Visit the aquarium to see and learn more about river otters, a variety of regional birds, freshwater fish from Lake Superior and the Amazon River, and our special saltwater feature, seahorses.







Lake Superior Zoo - Duluth

The Lake Superior Zoo is the only zoo in Northeastern Minnesota and Northwestern Wisconsin. There are close-up animal experiences that inspire connections to wildlife including action toward conservation in the region and around the world.
